  - Lived experience throughout the programme
  - Dedicated learning team



## 'Liberated Method'

#### 2 Rules:


Do no harm Stay legal

#### **5** Principles:

Understand, not assess Person sets the boundary/scope Pull for help on demand Decisions made in the work Time unlimited – takes what it takes Running budget: Proportionate Legal Auditable Necessary

- Connections matter


